



ANTI-DOPING RULES

World Gladiators Federation – Anti-Doping Policy

The World Gladiators Federation (WGF) stands firmly against the use of doping and any substances or methods that compromise the integrity of sport or the health of athletes. The Anti-Doping Policy follows international standards and aims to ensure fairness, safety, and ethical conduct in all gladiatorial competitions.

1. Objectives

Ensure a clean and fair competitive environment.

Protect the health and well-being of all athletes.

Uphold the honor and values of the Gladiator tradition.

Promote awareness and education on anti-doping measures.

2. Prohibited Substances and Methods

The WGF fully adopts the WADA (World Anti-Doping Agency) Prohibited List, updated annually.

The use of performance-enhancing drugs, masking agents, or methods intended to manipulate results is strictly forbidden.

Supplements must be used with caution and under certified supervision, as they may contain banned substances.

3. Testing and Controls

Doping tests may be conducted in-competition and out-of-competition, at national or international events.

All athletes must agree to testing as a condition of participation.



Refusal or failure to comply with testing protocols is treated as a violation.

◆ 4. *Education and Prevention*

The WGF promotes anti-doping education through workshops, digital materials, and collaboration with national agencies.

National federations are encouraged to integrate anti-doping awareness into their athlete training programs.

◆ 5. *Consequences and Sanctions*

Violations of the Anti-Doping Rules may result in disqualification, suspension, or permanent expulsion from WGF events.

Sanctions will follow the guidelines outlined by WADA and the WGF's disciplinary committees.

Appeals may be submitted according to the procedures established by the WGF and international legal frameworks.

◆ 6. *Cooperation with National and International Bodies*

The WGF works in collaboration with anti-doping organizations, laboratories, and government agencies to implement effective testing and enforcement.
